



Lesson Plan Summary Magic Tree House #30 Hurricane Heroes In Texas

Vocabulary Crossword Puzzle and Venn Diagram Activity

EACH STUDENT WILL:

Read and discuss the text Hurricanes Heroes in Texas.

- Students complete the crossword puzzle.
- Students complete a Venn diagram, comparing and contrasting the Galveston Hurricane of September 1900 with Hurricane Harvey of 2017.
- Students view video clips of hurricanes and storm surge.

Students write an informational paragraph(s) about the similarities and differences between the Great Galveston Hurricane and Hurricane Harvey.



CROSSWORD PUZZLE

- As an anticipatory introduction, view one or more of the video clips.
- Read and discuss Hurricane Heroes in Texas.
- Review the vocabulary list in the crossword "Word Box"
- Provide the crossword puzzle and have students work individually or in pairs to complete the puzzle.

VENN DIAGRAM/ INFORMATIONAL COMPARE AND CONTRAST WRITING

- Read and discuss pages Chapter 4 pp.51-63 and pp.90-92 in the <u>Fact Tracker: Texas</u>, either independently or in small groups.
- Students will visually organize information with the "hurricane image" Venn diagram. Students compare and contrast the Great Galveston Hurricane of 1900 and Hurricane Harvey of 2017.
- As an additional resource, view some or all of the video clips. (Older students can take notes.)
- Students will compose an informational writing piece from the information recorded on the Venn diagram.
- Final-copy thematic writing paper is provided for use following self, peer or adultassisted editing activity.


